Biographical Note: O.C. Havens was a photographer for the National Geographic Society (NGS). In the 1920s, Havens was a photographer for NGS-sponsored archeological expeditions to Pueblo Bonito, NM directed by Neil Merton Judd (1887-1976).

Scope and Content: The collection contains photographs made by Havens while visiting Zuni in the 1920s and includes images of Zuni Pueblo, people, ceremonies, irrigation work, and a shrine. Also included are photographs showing Pueblo Bonito expedition vehicles stuck in the mud after rains. Many photographs are briefly annotated on verso, probably by Havens.

Restrictions on Access: Original nitrate negatives are in cold storage and not available for viewing.

Restrictions on Use: Contact the repository for terms of use.

Acquisition Information: Gift from O.C. Havens, 1966.

Related Material: Other photographs by O.C. Havens are in the Papers of Neil Merton Judd at the National Anthropological Archives, and at the National Geographic Society.

Note on Processing: All of the original negatives have associated prints; however some prints do not have original negatives. Copy negatives for 33 of the 34 prints were made ca 1980s under a National Anthropological Archives preservation initiative. The collection was processed by Brandon Nero and Gina Rappaport, 2009.

Note on Description: Collection and image descriptions provided in this finding aid were compiled using the best available sources of information.
